
Save the Children is currently delivering lifesaving aid to 3.5 million vulnerable children and their families by working in countries neighbouring Ukraine, in addition to other multiple countries including Afghanistan, Syria, Palestine and Myanmar. The effect of humanitarian crises on everyone is something no child should ever have to experience. It can greatly affect their mental stability in the future. Save the Children is assisting children and families by offering mental health and psychological support.

In Ukraine, the charity are distributing essential supplies and winter kits of clothing and blankets amid the freezing temperatures. In Gaza and the West Bank, they are offering psychological support to families that have been affected. In Yemen, where 75% of schools have been destroyed in certain areas, they are currently building schools to get ready for the new school year in August.

Save the Children exists to help every child get the future they deserve, and we hope that TCA can get behind their aims on Friday. After all, a massive part of being nice and working hard is about considering those less fortunate than ourselves.
