The PE Department organises events for local primary schools through our Sports Leadership Partnership and students benefit from our excellent links with local, regional and national organisations.

Student Voice

We value the input of students in the current life and future direction of the Academy as our students are at the centre of all we do. Our Student Leadership Programme offers opportunities to serve on the Academy Parliament and Junior Leadership Team, and students are encouraged to take on a range of responsibilities including Head Boy, Head Girl and Academy Prefect roles. Partnering with Parents

Strong partnerships and engagement with our parents and carers are vital in ensuring students thrive at Thornhill Community Academy. Additional support and alternative provision is provided for those students who may need it in order to ensure excellent progress is made by all.

Behaviour

Behaviour is a crucial part of ensuring that a school operates in a way that teachers are able to teach, and students are able to learn. At TCA, we have extremely high expectations of students' conduct and have very clear systems in order to ensure that low-level disruption does not affect students' learning. Classrooms and corridors are quiet and purposeful and excellent behaviour is driven by students and staff working together towards our common goal.

Care and support

We are committed to providing exceptional care and support, ensuring our students' well-being is the foundation of their success. We believe our nurturing pastoral care and bespoke student support, combined with our rigorous standards of behaviour, help to ensure that all students achieve their full potential.

We promote students' wellbeing and mental health through a wide range of support systems and are committed to ensuring that students attend an Academy where hard work, excellent behaviour, mutual respect and awareness of all members of the Academy are celebrated. We look after each other, and support students through the ups and downs of their time with us. We expect them to be nice and work hard, and will ensure that we do the same for them.

Outstanding Pastoral Care

We have a dedicated, non-teaching pastoral team who play a key role in providing support and guidance for our students. Our Student Manager Team monitor students' progress academically, but also work hard to ensure that behaviour and engagement are exceptional. A strong sense of belonging is important, and the pastoral team will ensure that students know where to go, what to do and who to speak to, should they need any help at all.

Excellent Careers Guidance

We have an award-winning careers service and support network in place at the Academy. Students benefit from our excellent links with employers and education providers, providing many opportunities to enrich their knowledge and understanding of post-16 education and the world of work. Through our excellent careers advice service we are able to ensure the best outcomes for all students and a large percentage of our students continue their journey on to higher education.





ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Learning beyond the classroom is a really important aspect of our Academy. We provide a wealth of enriching opportunities that extend learning, improve teamwork and enable students to develop broader personal and social skills alongside academic rigour. Overseas excursions and educational visits deepen cultural understanding and broaden horizons. Within the Academy, regular enrichment days and visiting speakers further enhance the skills and aspirations of our students.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Every day the Academy provides the opportunity for students to participate in one of the many clubs and societies held before the Academy day, during social times or at the end of the day. Utilising our first class facilities we aim to inspire students and to build on their talents with a range of extra-curricular opportunities, encouraging all students to be involved.

Our thriving Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme has been very popular, giving students the opportunity to travel, develop a wide range of skills and be successful in all areas of this award.

Sporting Excellence

A range of sporting teams compete all year round, both locally and nationally, with opportunities for all students to take part. Our excellent indoor facilities include a four court sports hall for badminton, basketball, indoor football and indoor cricket, plus a gymnasium, which is utilised for trampolining, fitness and dodgeball. Outdoor facilities boast two football pitches, athletics track, training grid, rounders pitches and a multipurpose, all-weather games area for hockey, netball, football and cricket.

Additional Tuition

In addition to normal lessons, many students also receive supplementary support either through small group or individual tuition sessions during the Academy day or after school. This may be, for example, to support a child to be a more confident reader, or it could be to support a student as they prepare for examinations. Support is available, encouraged and is designed to genuinely benefit students.


