



***Baker Clause Policy Statement
Thornhill Community Academy
January 2020***

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8-13 are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Premises and facilities

The school will make the appropriate rooms or areas available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a member of their team.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature in the Careers Hub in our school library. We will additionally be happy to widely promote and advertise any vacancies which you may have for part time work or apprenticeship opportunities on our vacancies board. The library is available to all students at lunch and break times and after school until 5pm. Students can access resources during their one to one guidance interviews or other appropriate targeted group work. *Due to Covid19 the location of meetings may differ to ensure Government guidelines are met however students are able to access information/support on line using Teams or email.*
