1. What is Fresh Start Phonics?

Read Write Inc. Fresh Start is an age appropriate catch-up intervention programme for older students who need some help with their reading skills. It offers a simple but effective method to help students accelerate their reading progress. At Thornhill Community Academy, we offer daily sessions to small groups of students by phonics trained members of staff.

Fresh Start teaches students at their challenge point to ensure that they are not starting at a point that is too easy or too hard for them. This helps them learn to read accurately and fluently. They will also develop their comprehension, spelling and punctuation skills through targeted activities.

2. Which students need to do a Fresh Start Phonics course?

Each student at Thornhill Community Academy will sit a New Group Reading Test (NGRT). Tasks on the NGRT include sentence completion and reading comprehension. Standard Age Score (SAS) will be calculated once the test is complete. The SAS is based on the number of questions a student has answered correctly; the score is adjusted for age and placed on a scale that makes a comparison with a nationally representative sample of students of the same age across the UK. The average score is 100. Students who get an NGRT Standard Age Score (SAS) of below 85 are in need of intensive literacy interventions and will be screened for Phonics Intervention.
