**Definition:** (verb) bring to an end.



## Etymology:

The study of the origin (beginning) of words

### Origin



Middle English: from Old French *cesser*, from Latin *cessare* 'stop', from *cedere* 'to yield'.





## Synonyms of the word “cease” ...

End

Halt

Stop

Conclude



## Examples in Context

1. "You never cease to amaze me!" Her mother exclaimed.
2. By one o'clock, the rain had finally ceased.
3. "These restrictions will cease at the end of July," the Minister announced.



How words might be used by people in various professions...

"You should **cease** giving these tablets to your dog after one week," the vet instructed.



Use the word **cease** as many times as possible throughout the week to achieve positives!
